Background


- ~ 313,000 people are trafficked in Texas, up to 50% being youth
- ~88% of human trafficking victims encounter healthcare providers during their trafficking
- Healthcare providers report feeling illequipped to identify the warning signs and lack training in trauma-informed care
- There is a need to address this gap in training with opportunities for healthcare workers to apply their knowledge in a lowstakes environment.

Implementation

An eight-hour educational day was created including:

- Survivor testimonies
- Expert panel
- Breakout rooms
