
Do staff misconceptions on J-tip administration decrease after proper administration reeducation in the ED?

## **Background & Purpose**

- J-tip usage amongst Emergency Department staff (RNs and Medics) was not congruent.
- PIV insertion is a distressing procedures for pediatric patients and is commonly associated with feelings of anxiety, fear, and pain.
- PIV starts can be harder in children due to factors such as anatomical differences, thinner and more fragile veins, and acute or chronic conditions that can further complicate the procedure; therefore, these factors, in addition to the emotional stress the child is experiencing, may lead to multiple attempts at **PIV** insertion
- The purpose of this EBP Project is to determine the barriers that are affecting proper and effective use of J-Tips by ED staff

# Methodology

- Observed inconsistencies of J-tip use in ED
- Pre- and post-survey data to identify ED staff understanding and misconceptions
- Literature review using key words: "J-tip," "teaching EBP," "barriers"
- Consult with J-tip rep, Janette Gardea

# Decreasing misconceptions of J-tip administration in the Emergency Department



#### **Results**

#### **Post-survey**

100% Said they see decreased anxiety after waiting the appropriate amount of time after J-tip administration

100% Said reeducation helps the veins no longer blow

After reeducation, average confidence on J-Tip administration was 9 on a scale of 0-10



## Limitations

Length of time for data collection Number of survey responses Staff adherence

## **Recommendations**

- Educate all current and new ED staff (RNs and medics) on proper J-tip use using visual educational materials around the unit (Evidence: interactive teaching strategies improve outcomes)
- Educate all current and new ED staff on proper J-tip use through visual posters and demonstration at ED town hall to ensure all staff members educated appropriately and equally (Evidence: training does not change knowledge, but does reduce barriers)
- Child Life Specialists to download the phone app to help educate patients prior to administration. J-tip mobile app includes animated sounds, animated videos, how-to-use videos, and overviews. (Evidence: Nonpharmacologic methods and distraction have been shown to successfully mitigate pain, distress, and anxiety during PIV placement in children).
